Polynesia's traditional beauty oil

Monoï de Tahiti is obtained by traditionally processing fresh Tiare flowers (*Gardenia tahitensis*) grown in Polynesia in coconut oil. This special process is called Monoï de Tahiti.

Tiare Tahiti has become the cultural symbol of Polynesia. Fresh flowers collected daily are ritually processed by locals who gather them in the evenings. Climatic conditions and soil quality greatly contribute to the extraordinary properties of this oil.

Monoï de Tahiti provides natural beauty care and is traditionally used for headaches, styes, and insect bites. It has been included in Polynesian medicine books for its many healing properties.

Red seeds

The Roucou tree, also known as Annatto, Achiote or Urucum, is native to South America. Locals use it daily to protect themselves from the sun and insect bites. Natives received the name «Redskins» for this reason.

In 1845, seeds taken to Polynesia produced trees used for the same purpose, and additionally allowed decorative skin coloring during ceremonies. Traditionally, Marquesas women mix roucou seeds with coconut oil to color dancers' skin during ceremonies.

Due to its non-toxic content, roucou is also preferred by the food industry and has long been used in world-famous food products such as Dutch cheeses and butters.

Recent studies in health and cosmetics have shown that roucou is highly effective in creating sun barriers, providing antioxidant and photoprotective protection. For this reason, its use in products requiring natural sun protection is constantly increasing.

Properties: Moisturizing, Protective against external factors, Firming and smoothing, Protective against sunlight (Anti-radical and antioxidant), Tan accelerator, Natural colorant

The sacred tree with a thousand virtues

In the Pacific islands, Tamanu was used as a ritual object by native tribes and was accepted as a sacred tree "harboring a thousand virtues."

Tamanu fruit, leaves and roots were used to make medicines that became local medicine books. Its incredible healing properties are still seen as solutions for many ailments and applications continue to be developed.

In the 1950s, scientific research* went beyond healing time to reveal its anti-bacterial, anti-parasitic and dramatic anti-inflammatory benefits.

Properties: Soothing and protective (sunburns, inflammation, redness...)
Upper skin layer cell restructuring (burns, cracks...)
Anti-bacterial and antiseptic, Anti-acne, Moisturizing, nourishing and repairing
Microcirculation enhancer - Heavy legs syndrome

Rea Tahiti

Oceanian Saffron, known as Rea Tahiti, is preferred especially in skin products due to its rich structure in antioxidants, carotenoids, photoprotectors and intense Vitamin A. It comes from the turmeric family and has a color ranging from yellow to orange.

Thanks to its carotene and photoprotective properties, it helps achieve a deep and harmonious tan.

The name Frangipani is based on a legendary fragrance created by a 12th-century Italian perfumer. Centuries later, when European explorers discovered the Plumeria tree in the Caribbean, they noticed the scents were very similar and gave it this name.

Frangipani is the most admired and well-known tree among tropical trees.

In addition to its magnificent scent, it has been used by people for centuries due to its healing properties. Because of its ability to continuously bloom even when its leaves are plucked, it has been called the "immortal tree."

Traditional necklace from the Marquesas Islands

Natural Umuhei is a Marquesas Islands tradition. Every morning, women prepare a necklace for themselves with aromatic flowers. They wear it around their necks and carry it all day. In the evening, they crush the necklace they carried all day in coconut oil to extract its essence. The purpose of this ritual is to massage their partners with this oil mixture believed to have aphrodisiac properties.

The "Monoi Umuhei" that gives its name to this tradition is made from a blend of 7 Polynesian plants: Tiare, Ylang-Ylang, Blue Ageratum, Miri, Rea Tahiti (Oceanian Saffron), Pineapple and Sandalwood.

Argan oil is known to have many benefits for the skin. Thanks to its anti-aging properties that strengthen the immune system, it heals and protects the skin. For this reason, it is preferred in therapeutic massages.

The Argan tree grows predominantly in the Berber region of Morocco and has been called the "Tree of Life." Locals who have found healing through its antioxidant properties have long called argan oil the "miracle oil."
